











Information about the REACH regulation

As one of the leading trading companies for technical products, the ROLF WEBER GROUP is aware of its responsibility to protect the environment.

REACH stands for Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals.

Bearings and steel parts, as defined in Article 3 (3) of Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 (REACH), are articles because the specific shape or shape determines the function to a greater extent than the chemical composition.

Products themselves are not subject to registration under REACH.

However, there is a duty to register substances in articles if they are to be released under normal or reasonably foreseeable conditions (Article 7 (1)). This is usually not the case with rolling bearings or steel products.

There is also a duty to notify substances of very high concern in articles when they are present in a concentration of more than 0.1% by mass in the article and are produced or imported in quantities of more than 1 tons per year (Article 7 (2)). A substance is considered to be of very high concern if it meets the criteria of Article 57 (for example CMR substances) and determined in accordance with Article 59, i.e. has been included in a so-called candidate list for inclusion in Annex XIV of the REACH Regulation (list of substances subject to authorization).
